

Performance Review

Global markets were up low single digits this month, marking the fifth consecutive month of gains for global stocks.

The U.S economy continued on a solid footing with a resilient and growing labour market, strong service PMI, and improving industrial lead indicators, bolstering investor confidence. Inflation, however, remained at elevated levels, shifting expectations for central bank rate cuts to the latter half of the year. The EU and Chinese economies remained sluggish

At a regional level, nearly all major markets were up, with Developed Markets rising more than Emerging Markets. In developed markets, Europe outperformed North American markets, reflecting cyclical momentum and a pause in the technology rally.

At a sector level, performance was mostly risk-on with cyclical sectors gaining. Energy and Materials sectors rose most, fuelled by rising commodity prices and geo-political tension in the middle east, along with Financials which also rose. A standout was the Utilities sector, which despite being defensive, was among the best performing sectors. Among the laggards were Consumer Discretionary, with weak earnings results from branded apparel and competition in automotive, and defensive sectors such as Health Care and Staples. The Technology Sector paused from prior months' strong performance.

Performance Attribution

The fund was up low single-digit this month, and in line with its defensive strategy rose slightly less than the broader market.

Allocation was overall positive, with positive effects from underweights in Consumer Discretionary and Information Technology, which underperformed, and overweights in Materials and Utilities, which outperformed the broader market, partially offset by cash drag.

Selection was overall negative, with negative effects especially from Industrials, and to lesser extent from Utilities, and Communication.

On a single-stock level, among the leading contributors were semiconductor fabricator TSMC, precious metals company Wheaton and Newmont, and energy services company Baker Hughes. Among the laggards were IT-services companies GapGemini and Infosys, telecommunications company NTT, and pharma company Novartis

Current Positioning

The fund's strategy focuses on companies with above-average-, growing-, and sustainable dividend payments, with solid balance sheets, good management teams, and whose stocks are trading at attractive valuations.

In addition, companies must also have above-average profiles regarding environmental and social aspects as well as in terms of corporate governance. We select those companies that stand out on a sectoral- and regional comparison based on the examined sustainability criteria. Certain industries which do not comply with our sustainability standards, such as arms manufacturers and tobacco companies, are completely excluded from our investment universe.

Fund management continues to place a special emphasis on an overall defensive strategic positioning of the fund. Accordingly, the fund has larger sector exposure towards defensive sectors such as the Consumer Staples, Healthcare, Telecommunications (within the Communications sector) and Utilities, adding cyclicality via an overweight in Materials. Fund management also seeks exposure to sustainable structural growth trends, such as renewable energy, energy efficiency or natural ingredients. The fund's positioning is generally with a long-term view and accordingly only changes gradually during the course of a month.

During the month, we built a new position in transmission & distribution focussed utility CMS, in German utility E.On, semiconductor company Broadcom, Industrial company Siemens, and optical company EssilorLuxottica.

We reduced our positions, among others, in sports apparel maker Nike, Candian telecom provider BCE, and precious metals company Wheaton. We divested our positions in pharma company Bristol Myers, utility Eversource, and consumer staples company Unilever.

Outlook

Geo-political tensions continue in the aftermath of Russia's invasion of Ukraine, friction between China and the US, and conflict in the Middle East. Among the major economies macro conditions remain solid in the U.S., strong in India as well as in select Emerging markets, but sluggish in most of Europe and China. Global central banks face the challenge of having to strike a delicate balance between fighting still above-average and potentially "sticky" inflation by keeping interest rates elevated and reducing their balance sheets. whilst trying to avoid the detrimental effects of higher financing costs and tighter liquidity on the economy and resulting potential recession risks. Companies are navigating through an uncertain demand outlook, with cost pressure from higher financing expenses, global supply-chain rebalancing, and geo-political uncertainty.

In this volatile and uncertain market environment, fund management maintains its fundamentally defensive investment strategy. Dividend stocks remain a good option for investors in search of steady income and long-term capital appreciation, and we continue to believe in the appeal of a conservative dividend strategy with an attractive risk/return profile.

Glossary



Alpha

A measure of the difference between the risk-adjusted return on an investment and a benchmark. The alpha measures the part of the performance that cannot be explained by market movements or market risk, but rather is derived from the selection of securities within the market. Alpha is a way of measuring the active contribution to performance made by the portfolio manager. It is also a good yardstick to use when comparing several funds. The figure is calculated on a 3-yearly basis.

Average dividend yield

Measures the average dividend amount, based on the current share price. This figure is calculated based on the shares (including ADRs/GDRs - > Depositary receipts) and REITs contained in a fund.

Average market capitalization

Measures the average market capitalization of the shares, REITs and ADRs/GDRs (depositary receipts) contained in a fund. The market capitalization represents the total market value of a company as determined by multiplying the number of shares issued by the current share price.

Beta factor

A measure of sensitivity - given as the average percentage change in the price of a fund when the market (benchmark) rises or falls by 1%. A value over (under) 1 means that on average the fund exhibits more (less) volatility than the benchmark. The figure is calculated on a 3-yearly basis.

Correlation coefficient

Describes the degree to which two values (fund versus benchmark) move in the same direction. The value of the correlation coefficient is between -1 and +1. A correlation of +1 means that the fund generally moves in the same direction as the benchmark, while -1 indicates that the fund generally moves in the opposite direction. A correlation of 0 means that there is no relation between the price movements of the fund and the benchmark. The figure is calculated on a 3-yearly basis.

Coupon

The coupon is the portfolio's average weighted coupon.

Duration (in years/in months)

A measure of the sensitivity of an investment to changes in interest rates. Duration, which was developed by Frederick Macaulay, is the average period for which invested capital is committed. Because of the interest payable over time on the invested capital, duration is shorter than -> maturity. This version of duration is used in DWS Top Reporting and refers to invested assets (without "Cash and other holdings").

Information ratio

The information ratio measures the difference between the annualized average return of the fund and that of the benchmark, divided by the Tracking error. The higher this value is, the more the investor compensated for the risk in the fund. The figure is calculated on a 3-yearly basis.

Maximum drawdown

The maximum drawdown is the largest percentage drop in value in a given period of time. It measures the amount the fund falls from its highest point to its lowest point in the selected timeframe. The figure is calculated on a 3-yearly basis.

Modified duration (in years/in months)

Serves as a measure of interest-rate sensitivity. Modified duration indicates the percentage change in price of a bond (in a portfolio) when the market interest rate changes by 1%. In order to calculate the percentage change in the bond price, the modified duration of the bond is multiplied by the percentage change in the interest rate. This figure helps investors assess the risks and opportunities of a bond at a glance.

Sharpe ratio

A measure of risk developed by William F. Sharpe, defined as the excess return on an investment over that of a risk-free investment in relation to the risk of the investment. The higher the Sharpe ratio, the higher the return the investor receives for the risk the investment carries (expressed in volatility). The Sharpe ratio can be used to compare multiple funds. The figure is calculated on a 3-yearly basis.

Tracking error

The tracking error is the standard deviation of the yield differential between a fund and its benchmark. This makes it a measure of how well the fund manager tracks the benchmark. The figure is calculated on a 3-yearly basis.

VaR (Value at Risk)

A measure of risk that indicates the maximum fund losses with a given probability for a given period of time (holding period). VaR is calculated on the basis of the daily prices of the individual securities contained in the portfolio for a year.

Weighted Average Life

The weighted average life of the times of the principal repayments of a liability, i.e. a bond. Refers to invested fund assets (without "Cash and other holdings").

Viald

The yield is the annual return on a capital investment, measured as the actual interest earned (effective yield) on the capital invested. It is based on the fund's income (e.g., interest, dividends, realized capital gains) and change in the price of the assets held in the fund. The yield of a fund is

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derived from the invested assets (without "Cash and other holdings") and is presented as a "gross" figure, i.e., before the deduction of total expenses/fee.

Volatility

Volatility expresses the degree to which the yield on an investment (the price performance of a fund, for example) varies from a mean value in a specific period of time. This makes it a measure of fund risk. The greater the variation from the mean, the higher the volatility. Knowing the volatility allows investors to assess how uncertain the return potential of an investment is. The figure is calculated on a 3-yearly basis.
