## Performance Review

Global infrastructure securities fell in Aug but narrowly outperformed broader equity markets on a relative basis. Broader equity markets extended their July rally for the first half of Aug, but upward momentum was ground to a halt following the release of the U.S. Federal Reserve's July Federal Open Market Committee minutes, which dampened hopes of a reversal in its rate-hiking agenda anytime soon. The second half of the month saw broader equities pull back to end the month lower. Inflation data continued to run hot and while there are some signs that inflation may have peaked in the U.S., new record highs were hit in the UK and the Eurozone. Global growth continues to slow or even contract in certain countries adding additional pressure to risk assets as do the continuing war in Ukraine and the unfolding energy crisis in Europe. Global Infrastructure securities followed a similar pattern as the broader equity markets over the course of the month and ended the month slightly lower. Global infrastructure securities were down in all regions, with the Americas holding up the best, followed by APAC, while Europe had the largest losses. Within the Americas, Latin America Airports were the best performers with positive returns. Americas Utilities fell slightly while the Midstream Energy Segment pulled back a bit more, and Americas Communications was the laggard within the region. Turning to Asia Pacific, Japan infrastructure securities fell the least, while Australia infrastructure stocks had more meaningful losses, and Asia ex Japan had even sharper losses as China continues to grapple with city specific COVID-19 lockdowns. Finally, in Europe, all sectors posted negative returns with Europe Transports falling the least, followed by Europe Utilities. UK infrastructure stocks descended even more quickly, but the largest losses seen in all global infrastructure securities sector belonged to the Europe Communications group as certain tower names pulled back precipitously.

## Performance Attribution

The fund delivered negative nominal returns during August with the Americas having the least negative contribution. The Asia Pacific region had a slightly higher negative contribution while Europe had the largest negative contribution. Within the Americas, Latin America Airports was the only sector to have a positive contribution to return, while Americas Communications had the greatest negative contribution. The Americas Midstream Energy segment also had a meaningful negative contribution, while Americas Utilities had a less negative contribution, and Americas Rail was just a slight negative contribution. Moving to Asia Pacific, all groups had negative contributions with Japan being the least negative. Asia ex Japan narrowly edged out Australia for the largest negative contribution within the region. Lastly, in Europe, all groups here also had a negative contribution to return. Europe Transports was the least negative, followed by Europe Utilities, then Europe Communications, with UK infrastructure securities having the largest negative contribution in the region.

## Current Positioning

Exposure continues to be driven by stock-level fundamentals and relative valuations with a defensive tilt. During August, the largest intentional increase in exposure was to Americas Utilities given their defensive nature and compelling valuations. The second largest intentional increase in exposure was to Europe Utilities for similar reasons, but to a slightly lesser extent. Exposure to UK infrastructure securities was also intentionally increased primarily through utility names. Europe Transports exposure was intentionally decreased given the high cost of fuel and increased recession risks. Exposure to Americas Midstream Energy continued to be reduced given rich valuations, falling oil prices, and the prospect of natural gas prices receding to more normalized levels. Exposure to Asia ex Japan infrastructure stocks was also intentionally reduced given the new and ongoing lockdowns in China related to COVID-19. In absolute terms, which considers both active management and market movements, the largest increases in portfolio weights belonged to Americas Utilities, Europe Utilities, and Latin America Airports while the largest decrease in portfolio weights was seen in Europe Transports, Asia ex Japan infrastructure stocks, and Americas Rail. Our largest sector weightings on an absolute basis remain in Americas Utilities, Americas Midstream Energy, and Americas Communications. Finally, our cash position was slightly decreased in August and represents ~0.9% of the portfolio as of the month's end.

## Outlook

For the balance of 2022, we remain focused on relative valuations and companies that can maintain and grow cash flows as we assess opportunities within the infrastructure space. Volatility will likely continue, exacerbated by the war in Ukraine and central banks' tightening policies. Infrastructure should benefit given their inflation passthrough capabilities and necessity-based assets. We expect performance dispersion to continue, affording active managers alpha opportunities. At a sector level, U.S. regulated utilities fundamentals are improving, and the stability of the sector's cash flows should benefit multiples as growth and inflation are likely to decelerate. In Europe, our views are more nuanced, and we favour the electric grid companies over the gas companies given the uncertainty surrounding the price and sourcing of natural gas. In transports, fundamentals remain mixed across regions and subsectors. While limited capacity in some areas provides pricing support today, slowing economic growth and increased recession risks will likely have a negative impact on volumes and prices going forward. The outlook in Europe is further clouded by the ongoing Ukraine/Russia conflict given that companies in the region are being impacted more directly by inflation costs in fuel. We expect the Americas midstream energy segment to remain volatile as uncertainty of Russian energy exports continues but should benefit this space longer-term as high prices should incentivize increased production/export volumes from North America. Communications names could benefit near-term if bond yields stabilize. In the intermediate term, robust fundamentals and inorganic growth opportunities continue to provide support for towers on a global basis. We continue to seek the best risk-adjusted returns and favour "pure-play" companies with strong balance sheets, agile management teams, stable demand, and quality business models which may provide a degree of insulation from external factors.

## General Risk Warnings

## Alpha

A measure of the difference between the risk-adjusted return on an investment and a benchmark. The alpha measures the part of the performance that cannot be explained by market movements or market risk, but rather is derived from the selection of securities within the market. Alpha is a way of measuring the active contribution to performance made by the portfolio manager. It is also a good yardstick to use when comparing several funds. The figure is calculated on a 3-yearly basis.

## Average dividend yield

Measures the average dividend amount, based on the current share price. This figure is calculated based on the shares (including ADRs/GDRs - > Depositary receipts) and REITs contained in a fund.

## Average market capitalization

Measures the average market capitalization of the shares, REITs and ADRs/GDRs (depository receipts) contained in a fund. The market capitalization represents the total market value of a company as determined by multiplying the number of shares issued by the current share price.

## Beta factor

A measure of sensitivity - given as the average percentage change in the price of a fund when the market (benchmark) rises or falls by 1%. A value over (under) 1 means that on average the fund exhibits more (less) volatility than the benchmark. The figure is calculated on a 3-yearly basis.

## Correlation coefficient

Describes the degree to which two values (fund versus benchmark) move in the same direction. The value of the correlation coefficient is between -1 and +1. A correlation of +1 means that the fund generally moves in the same direction as the benchmark, while -1 indicates that the fund generally moves in the opposite direction. A correlation of 0 means that there is no relation between the price movements of the fund and the benchmark. The figure is calculated on a 3-yearly basis.

## Coupon

The coupon is the portfolio's average weighted coupon.

## Duration (in years/in months)

A measure of the sensitivity of an investment to changes in interest rates. Duration, which was developed by Frederick Macaulay, is the average period for which invested capital is committed. Because of the interest payable over time on the invested capital, duration is shorter than -> maturity. This version of duration is used in DWS Top Reporting and refers to invested assets (without "Cash and other holdings").

## Information ratio

The information ratio measures the difference between the annualized average return of the fund and that of the benchmark, divided by the Tracking error. The higher this value is, the more the investor compensated for the risk in the fund. The figure is calculated on a 3-yearly basis.

## Maximum drawdown

The maximum drawdown is the largest percentage drop in value in a given period of time. It measures the amount the fund falls from its highest point to its lowest point in the selected timeframe. The figure is calculated on a 3-yearly basis.

## Modified duration (in years/in months)

Serves as a measure of interest-rate sensitivity. Modified duration indicates the percentage change in price of a bond (in a portfolio) when the market interest rate changes by 1%. In order to calculate the percentage change in the bond price, the modified duration of the bond is multiplied by the percentage change in the interest rate. This figure helps investors assess the risks and opportunities of a bond at a glance.

## Sharpe ratio

A measure of risk developed by William F. Sharpe, defined as the excess return on an investment over that of a risk-free investment in relation to the risk of the investment. The higher the Sharpe ratio, the higher the return the investor receives for the risk the investment carries (expressed in volatility). The Sharpe ratio can be used to compare multiple funds. The figure is calculated on a 3-yearly basis.

## Tracking error

The tracking error is the standard deviation of the yield differential between a fund and its benchmark. This makes it a measure of how well the fund manager tracks the benchmark. The figure is calculated on a 3-yearly basis.

## VaR (Value at Risk)

A measure of risk that indicates the maximum fund losses with a given probability for a given period of time (holding period). VaR is calculated on the basis of the daily prices of the individual securities contained in the portfolio for a year.

## Weighted Average Life

The weighted average life of the times of the principal repayments of a liability, i.e. a bond. Refers to invested fund assets (without "Cash and other holdings").

## Yield

The yield is the annual return on a capital investment, measured as the actual interest earned (effective yield) on the capital invested. It is based on the fund's income (e.g., interest, dividends, realized capital gains) and change in the price of the assets held in the fund. The yield of a fund is



derived from the invested assets (without "Cash and other holdings") and is presented as a "gross" figure, i.e., before the deduction of total expenses/fee.

**Volatility**  
Volatility expresses the degree to which the yield on an investment (the price performance of a fund, for example) varies from a mean value in a specific period of time. This makes it a measure of fund risk. The greater the variation from the mean, the higher the volatility. Knowing the volatility allows investors to assess how uncertain the return potential of an investment is. The figure is calculated on a 3-yearly basis.
