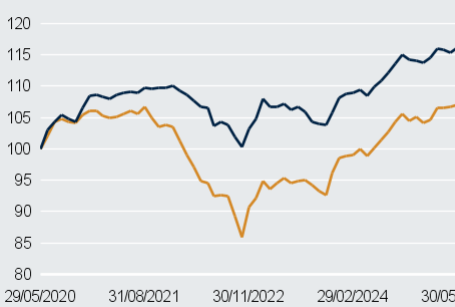

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## Performance Review

Asian credit continued its recovery since “Liberation Day”, as trade talks progressed, with the US and China agreeing to lower tariffs for three months. The JACI Asia Pacific Index (JACI APAC) returned +0.24%, with High Yield (HY) outperformed Investment Grade (IG) on improved sentiment. JACI APAC spread to worst tightened 22bps, with IG tightening 17bps and HY tightened 63bps. JACI APAC spread returned +1.04%, while JACI APAC Treasury returned -0.79%.

US Treasury yields rallied in April as investors diversified away from USD assets and demanded higher return to hold them. The UST curve steepened, with the 30y yield breached 5% and reached as high as 5.14% before settling at 4.93% after softer-than-expected US inflation. Moody’s cut its US sovereign rating, removing its final AAA. Market now prices in two Fed cuts in 2025, with the first expected in September. 10y UST yield ended the month 24bps higher at 4.4%.

Asian central banks maintained accommodative policies to support growth and cushion trade-related risks. PBoC cut its 7-day reverse repo rate by 10bps to 1.40% and RRR by 50bps. Bank of Korea cut rate by 25bps to 2.5%, its fourth since October 2024. Bank Indonesia also cut by 25bps to 5.50% as pressure on IDR eased.

The Fund was active in May’s primary market, participating in four IG and two HY deals. IG names included a Japanese financial, Australian energy, and two Korean quasi-sovereigns. HY included a Chinese industrial and Indonesia oil & gas name. In secondary, the Fund added positions in Australian oil & gas, an Indian toll road operator and a Macau gaming operator. Portfolio duration stayed near benchmark.

APAC USD bond issuance slowed in May amid UST volatility, though demand remained strong with oversubscribed books. Total issuance was US\$21.4bn, with US\$18.7bn from IG issuers, mainly from Australia, China, Japan, South Korea, and Malaysia. HY Supply came mainly from China and Indonesia.

## Outlook

Asian credit rebounded strongly from the Liberation Day selloff, with JACI APAC credit spreads back to March levels. The recovery reflects strong technical support in the market and continued demand from investors seeking diversification, which helped limit outflows. While some volatility is expected as we approach the end of the 90-day reciprocal tariff pause, we remain cautiously optimistic. We believe solid technical will continue to provide support, and any near-term volatility could offer attractive entry points for the Fund.

The new issuance market remained active, especially in high quality IG, where demand was strong. We expect issuers to return once UST volatility subsides and primary deals should continue to offer attractive new issue premiums.

We maintain a neutral duration view, taking a cautious stance amid ongoing tariff developments. While tariffs may put upward pressure on inflation, they are also expected to weigh on growth. Our base case is slower US growth, not recession or stagflation, unless trade tensions escalate. We continue to hold short-dated bonds for carry and favour high-quality HY names in Indonesia, India and Macau gaming. On the IG side, we remain constructive on Japanese insurance subordinated debt for its strong fundamentals and attractive yields.

## Alpha

A measure of the difference between the risk-adjusted return on an investment and a benchmark. The alpha measures the part of the performance that cannot be explained by market movements or market risk, but rather is derived from the selection of securities within the market. Alpha is a way of measuring the active contribution to performance made by the portfolio manager. It is also a good yardstick to use when comparing several funds. The figure is calculated on a 3-yearly basis.

## Average dividend yield

Measures the average dividend amount, based on the current share price. This figure is calculated based on the shares (including ADRs/GDRs - > Depositary receipts) and REITs contained in a fund.

## Average market capitalization

Measures the average market capitalization of the shares, REITs and ADRs/GDRs (depositary receipts) contained in a fund. The market capitalization represents the total market value of a company as determined by multiplying the number of shares issued by the current share price.

## Beta factor

A measure of sensitivity - given as the average percentage change in the price of a fund when the market (benchmark) rises or falls by 1%. A value over (under) 1 means that on average the fund exhibits more (less) volatility than the benchmark. The figure is calculated on a 3-yearly basis.

## Correlation coefficient

Describes the degree to which two values (fund versus benchmark) move in the same direction. The value of the correlation coefficient is between -1 and +1. A correlation of +1 means that the fund generally moves in the same direction as the benchmark, while -1 indicates that the fund generally moves in the opposite direction. A correlation of 0 means that there is no relation between the price movements of the fund and the benchmark. The figure is calculated on a 3-yearly basis.

## Coupon

The coupon is the portfolio's average weighted coupon.

## Duration (in years/in months)

A measure of the sensitivity of an investment to changes in interest rates. Duration, which was developed by Frederick Macaulay, is the average period for which invested capital is committed. Because of the interest payable over time on the invested capital, duration is shorter than -> maturity. This version of duration is used in DWS Top Reporting and refers to invested assets (without "Cash and other holdings").

## Information ratio

The information ratio measures the difference between the annualized average return of the fund and that of the benchmark, divided by the Tracking error. The higher this value is, the more the investor compensated for the risk in the fund. The figure is calculated on a 3-yearly basis.

## Maximum drawdown

The maximum drawdown is the largest percentage drop in value in a given period of time. It measures the amount the fund falls from its highest point to its lowest point in the selected timeframe. The figure is calculated on a 3-yearly basis.

## Modified duration (in years/in months)

Serves as a measure of interest-rate sensitivity. Modified duration indicates the percentage change in price of a bond (in a portfolio) when the market interest rate changes by 1%. In order to calculate the percentage change in the bond price, the modified duration of the bond is multiplied by the percentage change in the interest rate. This figure helps investors assess the risks and opportunities of a bond at a glance.

## Sharpe ratio

A measure of risk developed by William F. Sharpe, defined as the excess return on an investment over that of a risk-free investment in relation to the risk of the investment. The higher the Sharpe ratio, the higher the return the investor receives for the risk the investment carries (expressed in volatility). The Sharpe ratio can be used to compare multiple funds. The figure is calculated on a 3-yearly basis.

## Tracking error

The tracking error is the standard deviation of the yield differential between a fund and its benchmark. This makes it a measure of how well the fund manager tracks the benchmark. The figure is calculated on a 3-yearly basis.

## VaR (Value at Risk)

A measure of risk that indicates the maximum fund losses with a given probability for a given period of time (holding period). VaR is calculated on the basis of the daily prices of the individual securities contained in the portfolio for a year.

## Weighted Average Life

The weighted average life of the times of the principal repayments of a liability, i.e. a bond. Refers to invested fund assets (without "Cash and other holdings").

## Yield

The yield is the annual return on a capital investment, measured as the actual interest earned (effective yield) on the capital invested. It is based on the fund's income (e.g., interest, dividends, realized capital gains) and change in the price of the assets held in the fund. The yield of a fund is

derived from the invested assets (without "Cash and other holdings") and is presented as a "gross" figure, i.e., before the deduction of total expenses/fee.

## Volatility

Volatility expresses the degree to which the yield on an investment (the price performance of a fund, for example) varies from a mean value in a specific period of time. This makes it a measure of fund risk. The greater the variation from the mean, the higher the volatility. Knowing the volatility allows investors to assess how uncertain the return potential of an investment is. The figure is calculated on a 3-yearly basis.
