Fund Management's Comment

A relative feeling of calm finally returned to the markets after 4 wild and volatile months. Main driver of the positive sentiment in risky asset, equities and credit alike, was the surprisingly quick cease fire agreement in the trade war between China and the US. Also, the market's realization that Trump was prepared to back down on most of his (erratic) tariff threats, which gave rise to the term TACO (Trump Always Chickens Out) and stronger markets - US equities had the best month in 1.5 years and European stock gained more than 5%.

Towards the end of May jitters returned, as the US lost its AAA status with the last of the large rating institutes and the sustainability of US debt levels and the current budget deficit was increasingly being questioned, particular by non-US investors. The ongoing dedollarization was becoming more evident, something which is also benefiting Euro Investment Grade (IG).

EURO IG tightened 16bp versus government bonds – the best month since November 2023 and that was despite May being the busiest month ever for supply with over 100 new issues.

DWS Invest Euro Corporate Bonds had good month returning 0.7%, outperforming the benchmark by 0.22%

Performance Review

The ICE BofA Euro Corporate Index could not quite regain all the lost ground from April but still tightened 13bp versus government bonds, making it the best month since November 2023.

It was very much a month of risk compression where the subordinated segments outperformed seniors and cyclical (topical) sectors tightened more than low risk non-cyclicals. Subordinated non-fin tightened 17bp compared to 7bp for non-fin seniors and on the financial side it was less expressed with respectively -15bp and -12bp. Strongest sectors was Insurance Sub (-18bp) followed by Real Estate (-14bp), Banks (-13bp), and Autos and Media -12bp. Weakest Sector was Consumer Services (-2bp) and Utilities (-5bp).

The record issuance appears to have had no influence on secondary spreads and may even have helped the tightening as there was follow up buying in most of the new issues.

Performance Attribution

DWS Invest Euro Corporate bonds gained 0.71% in May outperforming its benchmark by 0.22%. The new issues from May and the end of April undoubtedly had a positive effect on performance in the fund, as very few of the over 100 new issues ended the month wider. The overweight in second and third tier banks from Southern Europe and Germany helped as these more than reversed the widening of April and several of the banks are featuring on our top ten single names.

Best sector in the portfolio was Banks closely followed by Industrials (which is also our largest overweight especially Industrial Transportation (Airports and Toll roads)). Second best sector was Real Estate which continues to hold up very well. It was surprising to see that every sector had a positive active contribution, even those where we are underweight risk, with the exception of Insurance.

Current Positioning

We lowed the risk in the portfolio marginally during May, after having run it up during late April. Most of the small reduction came through profit taking, as we were careful to sell paper with a similar risk profile when we raised cash in order to participate in the new issues. Largest new contribution to risk came from Autos and Parts where we had cheap new issuance, we have now turned our underweight into a small overweight in the as we believe a lot of bad news is priced in. It should be noted that we are somewhat worried about the rapidly eroding profit margins at many of the issuers in the face of the uncertainty from Trump's actions, what could lead to some credit rating actions over time. We also added a special Chemical name through issuance which has taken us to a an overweight.

Against these we reduced our healthy overweights in Healthcare and Telecommunications through profit taking.

As mentioned, the portfolio still holds more risk than the benchmark and we remain constructive especially after having seen the wall of cash that is out there. €91bn of supply in non-fin in five weeks being digested in the face of the highest uncertainty after the index tightened in 2023 and 2024 is astounding and possibly unprecedented. The increased and growing Asian participation in EUR IG will only help stabilize out markets and with issuance bound to slow down into summer, we should grind tighter. Obviously, this depends on what exactly happens on the July 9th, when Trump's 90 day tariff pause ends. We may get another TACO event though.

Outlook

June 5th, the ECB meets, another rate cut is widely expected. Quite possibly the penultimate cut for 2025.

June 18th, the Federal Reserve (FOMC) meets, despite the loud criticism of Chairman Powell by Trump, no change is expected as the FOMC will remain data dependent in the face of the uncertainty created by Trump's policies.

In addition, keep an eye out for further signs of the ongoing de-dollarization.

June 12th, 30-year US treasury Auction and on the 16th, there will be a 20-year auction.

Big Beautiful Bill, the many issues are unlikely to be resolved during June or even before Trump's 4th of July deadline. More likely is before the September 30th debt ceiling deadline.

June 15th, G7 leaders summit commences in Kananaskis, Canada. There will be a large number of new leaders attending, Japan, Germany, Canada, USA and the UK. June 24th, the annual NATO summit and first under Trump 2.0 will take place in the Netherlands with 45 heads of state taking part.

Glossary



Alpha

A measure of the difference between the risk-adjusted return on an investment and a benchmark. The alpha measures the part of the performance that cannot be explained by market movements or market risk, but rather is derived from the selection of securities within the market. Alpha is a way of measuring the active contribution to performance made by the portfolio manager. It is also a good yardstick to use when comparing several funds. The figure is calculated on a 3-yearly basis.

Average dividend yield

Measures the average dividend amount, based on the current share price. This figure is calculated based on the shares (including ADRs/GDRs - > Depositary receipts) and REITs contained in a fund.

Average market capitalization

Measures the average market capitalization of the shares, REITs and ADRs/GDRs (depositary receipts) contained in a fund. The market capitalization represents the total market value of a company as determined by multiplying the number of shares issued by the current share price.

Beta factor

A measure of sensitivity - given as the average percentage change in the price of a fund when the market (benchmark) rises or falls by 1%. A value over (under) 1 means that on average the fund exhibits more (less) volatility than the benchmark. The figure is calculated on a 3-yearly basis.

Correlation coefficient

Describes the degree to which two values (fund versus benchmark) move in the same direction. The value of the correlation coefficient is between -1 and +1. A correlation of +1 means that the fund generally moves in the same direction as the benchmark, while -1 indicates that the fund generally moves in the opposite direction. A correlation of 0 means that there is no relation between the price movements of the fund and the benchmark. The figure is calculated on a 3-yearly basis.

Coupon

The coupon is the portfolio's average weighted coupon.

Duration (in years/in months)

A measure of the sensitivity of an investment to changes in interest rates. Duration, which was developed by Frederick Macaulay, is the average period for which invested capital is committed. Because of the interest payable over time on the invested capital, duration is shorter than -> maturity. This version of duration is used in DWS Top Reporting and refers to invested assets (without "Cash and other holdings").

Information ratio

The information ratio measures the difference between the annualized average return of the fund and that of the benchmark, divided by the Tracking error. The higher this value is, the more the investor compensated for the risk in the fund. The figure is calculated on a 3-yearly basis.

Maximum drawdown

The maximum drawdown is the largest percentage drop in value in a given period of time. It measures the amount the fund falls from its highest point to its lowest point in the selected timeframe. The figure is calculated on a 3-yearly basis.

Modified duration (in years/in months)

Serves as a measure of interest-rate sensitivity. Modified duration indicates the percentage change in price of a bond (in a portfolio) when the market interest rate changes by 1%. In order to calculate the percentage change in the bond price, the modified duration of the bond is multiplied by the percentage change in the interest rate. This figure helps investors assess the risks and opportunities of a bond at a glance.

Sharpe ratio

A measure of risk developed by William F. Sharpe, defined as the excess return on an investment over that of a risk-free investment in relation to the risk of the investment. The higher the Sharpe ratio, the higher the return the investor receives for the risk the investment carries (expressed in volatility). The Sharpe ratio can be used to compare multiple funds. The figure is calculated on a 3-yearly basis.

Tracking error

The tracking error is the standard deviation of the yield differential between a fund and its benchmark. This makes it a measure of how well the fund manager tracks the benchmark. The figure is calculated on a 3-yearly basis.

VaR (Value at Risk)

A measure of risk that indicates the maximum fund losses with a given probability for a given period of time (holding period). VaR is calculated on the basis of the daily prices of the individual securities contained in the portfolio for a year.

Weighted Average Life

The weighted average life of the times of the principal repayments of a liability, i.e. a bond. Refers to invested fund assets (without "Cash and other holdings").

Yield

The yield is the annual return on a capital investment, measured as the actual interest earned (effective yield) on the capital invested. It is based on the fund's income (e.g., interest, dividends, realized capital gains) and change in the price of the assets held in the fund. The yield of a fund is

derived from the invested assets (without "Cash and other holdings") and is presented as a "gross" figure, i.e., before the deduction of total expenses/fee.

Volatility

Volatility expresses the degree to which the yield on an investment (the price performance of a fund, for example) varies from a mean value in a specific period of time. This makes it a measure of fund risk. The greater the variation from the mean, the higher the volatility. Knowing the volatility allows investors to assess how uncertain the return potential of an investment is. The figure is calculated on a 3-yearly basis.
